John was the second of four boys born to Charlotte and Jack West. He did most of the things that a boy would do while growing up through the primary and secondary education system in Fergus Falls, MN.. He showed an aptitude for building and fixing things. In this same time frame he became interested in guns of all kinds and picked up all kinds of information from our Father. He also became interested in stock car racing and entered all the eligible events for at least a couple of years. After graduation, he attend the U of North Dakota in Grand Forks. ND for a short time then transferred to Moorhead State University in Moorhead, MN where he graduated with a Teaching degree. He started teaching in Kenyon, MN for a short time then moved to Onalaska, WI where he taught business education courses at Logan High School in LaCrosse, WI until he retired in about 2000. A couple of years after he retired, he and Kathy moved to the Checotah area of Oklahoma. We saw each other 5 or 6 times during those twenty plus years, but we did keep in touch a couple time a month by phone to update each other. The main obituary has the "rest of the story".

“ John Chester West was born in Fergus Falls, Minnesota. He taught business education and typing at the high school level for nearly half of his life in La Crosse, Wisconsin. John had many talents. He was an accomplished hobby stock car racer and won many trophies in competitions on dirt, blacktop and on ice. He even took an interest in go-cart racing. John was an exceptional welder, metalworker, carpenter and rock layer. He designed and built the ironwork for the gazebo in Galesville, Wisconsin’s central square. He also created replicas of the arch truss McGilvray Bridges in Wisconsin for a restaurant called Seven Bridges. (See accompanying photo of two of the bridges that are now in the yard in Oklahoma) He truly enjoyed raising sheep and caring for his land. When John discovered the Cowboy Action Shooting sport, he jumped in and loved every event. He even started his own club, the Rattlesnake Mountain Rangers on his ranch. John designed and built the steel targets and all of the various stages involved in a Cowboy Shoot with the help of his friends, Ronnie, Danny and others who volunteered their services. With the alias of “Black River Jack,” John attended shoots in several states on a regular basis. The friendships he made through the sport were amazing and priceless. As age took its toll on John, he had to limit his shooting outings, but kept endlessly busy with his greenhouse, sheep and property maintenance. John kept up on the world and national news and enjoyed talking on any political topic. Rest in Peace, John. You will be sadly missed.

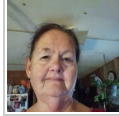

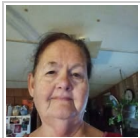
