Her unwavering dedication to her family and friends. When we were blessed to come together as a family, the Hahn house was the place to be for amazing meals, company and laughter.

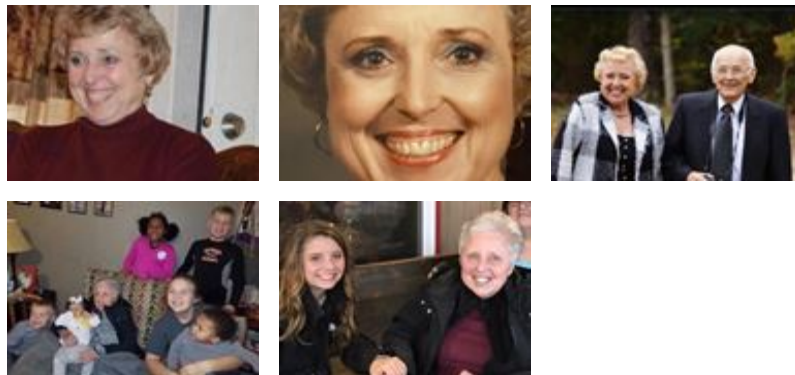
