James Owen Taylor a resident of Henryetta passed this life on March 3, 2018 in Oklahoma City at the age of 85. Born June 17, 1932 in Haskell, Ok to James Henry and Emma Love (Maddox) Taylor.

After graduating Haskell High School Owen enlisted in the US Army and served during the Korean War and retired with the rank of Major. He then enrolled in the University Of Oklahoma School Of Pharmacy, Dec 12, 1958 and after graduating became the director of Pharmacy at the Ellison Infirmary that is now the Goddard Health Center. In 1970 he and his wife Janice opened Taylor Pharmacy in Henryetta and served the Henryetta community until retiring in 2006. He a former member of the Henryetta School Board, the Henryetta Chamber of Commerce and served as a Deacon and Sunday School teacher at the Henryetta First Baptist Church for many years.

He is preceded in death by his parents, Brothers; Earl and W.C. Taylor and sisters; Betty Jean Bradley and Shirley McCormack

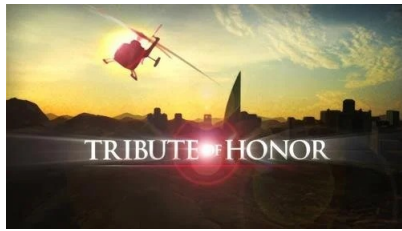
