



## Sharon Warner

April 26, 1945 - January 16, 2016

Sharon K. Warner was taken home to the Lord on January 16, 2016. She was born in Kansas City, Kansas on April 26, 1945 to Edgar and Florence Blickenstaff. She was 70 years old.

Sharon grew up in Smith County Kansas until 1955 when she moved to Furnas County Nebraska where her parents farmed. She graduated from Norton High School in 1963 and later graduated from cosmetology school in McCook Nebraska. During this time, she met Dale L. Warner and they were united in marriage in 1964. They made their home West of Wilsonville until 1967 when they moved to Hendley to farm. In 1983 they moved to Lebanon Nebraska where she worked for Burns Laboratory. In 1986 Sharon and Dale became over the road truck drivers until 1993 when they moved to Bozeman Montana. Sharon and Dale then moved to Weleetka, Oklahoma in 1997 where they raised cattle and farmed. Sharon remained on the farm until her death. They were married for 51 years.

Sharon was a member of the Weleetka First Baptist Church. She enjoyed many things including going to the lake, cooking, mowing, shooting, farming, but most of all she enjoyed her family and friends.

Survivors include her two daughters and their husbands; Sheila and Cline Worlow of Weleetka, Oklahoma; Gina and Shay Wise of Midland, Texas; five

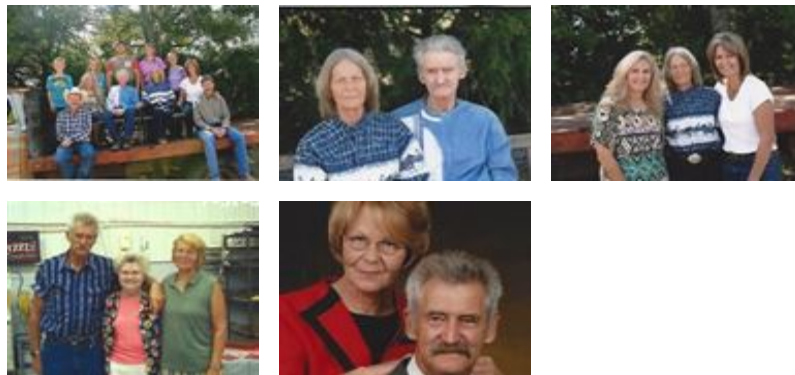
